PRESIDENT'S GREETINGS

I would like to use this opportunity to reflect on an incredible year for our wonderful sport.

2014 has been a year of rapid progression, a year of new horizons and adventures, a year of projects fulfilled and challenges overcome.

I often highlight the fact that Modern Pentathlon is a thrilling spectacle to watch, but at the same time a safe and responsible sport. Above all, it is an innovative sport, one that never stops wanting to grow and evolve, and this was never more apparent than in 2014.

One of the cornerstones of our development is the cultivation of the non-Olympic sub-sports of Biathle, Triathle and Tetrathlon, all of which enjoyed unprecedented growth this year. Indeed, before 2014 is over we will have watched Triathle make its debut in the Asian Beach Games in Thailand and watched Biathle make waves in the 1st FISU International University Beach Games in Brazil.

In May, we embarked on an exciting new adventure by joining FISU. We have been thrilled to be embraced as part of the global university sports community, and join a body with which we share so many values. Sport and education go hand in hand in developing great people! We have asked to be considered as demonstration sport at the 2017 Universiade in Taipei, with a view to competing in the FISU World University Games in 2018.

This was the year when UIPM became a full member of the International Paralympic Council (IPC). Now disabled athletes all over the world can, like able-bodied athletes, fulfil the dream of pursuing Pentathlon disciplines in the knowledge that we are working hard to create an infrastructure for them to compete.



It was announced in April that Modern Pentathlon would be one of at least 17 sports to feature in the inaugural World Urban Games, scheduled for 2016. The concept mixes sport and urban culture and we see this as a key tool in encouraging more young people from different backgrounds to take up Pentathlon.

2014 was a breathtaking year of competition in elite Modern Pentathlon. A triumphant World Cup circuit came to an exciting climax in Sarasota, USA, and then we had two monumentally successful events in quick succession: the Youth Olympic Games in Nanjing, China and the Senior World Championships in Warsaw, Poland. In both of those events we broke new ground with more athletes taking part and more countries winning medals.

Without investing in development we would stand still, and our sport continued to grow across the world in 2014 through the excellent work of our six Confederations and nearly 130 individual National Federations. There are now exciting possibilities for Pentathletes all the way from South America to Africa and Oceania.

My friends, this time last year we were happy and relieved. We reflected on the vote of confidence we had received from the Olympic community when, at the IOC session in Buenos Aires, Modern Pentathlon was integrated as one of the 25 core Olympic sports until 2020.

That endorsement gave myself, Secretary General Shiny Fang and the UIPM Executive Board a new injection of energy and passion as we strive to achieve all of our goals, and keep Pentathlon at the forefront of global sport. With all of this in mind, it was satisfying that in 2014 we maintained and improved our excellent lines of communication and cooperation within the Olympic sports community. The IOC President, Dr Thomas Bach, was our guest at the YOG in Nanjing and we have very healthy relations with the IOC Executive Board and other influential bodies such as ANOC - and its President, Sheikh Ahmad Al-Fahad Al-Sabah - and the Organising Committees of the 2016 and 2020 Olympic Games in Rio and Tokyo. Myself and Vice-President Samaranch have worked tirelessly to ensure we are always part of the international sporting conversation.

At UIPM we are acutely aware of our place in history and our responsibilities. It is my earnest belief that our founder, Baron Pierre de Coubertin, would look at our achievements in 2014 and be proud.

REPORT OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL



Dear UIPM friends,

This new publication will, I hope, leave you in awe and make you proud of the accomplishments of the Modern Pentathlon family across the world over this past year.

Dozens of countries, hundreds of events, thousands of athletes have made our journey through the 2014 season a memorable one. To all of them, to the various organizing committees and to our commercial partners goes our utmost appreciation.

CHANGE IS NOT OVER

We have overcome our lifetime threat in 2013 and can be proud of our leaders for ensuring that modern pentathlon has remained an Olympic sport. But we have learnt with that process that we cannot take our position within the word of sport as granted. Nor should we be pressured to make changes to the sport as we have been during that particular time. Instead, similar to the IOC and its current Agenda 2020 today and similar to all of us in our everyday life, UIPM needs to continuously look forward, adjust and innovate. This comes with a price, as we all struggle with change, but it is inevitable in order to remain relevant for the 21st century. We need to take advantage now of the truce and continue the process of innovation with even greater intensity and in even greater depth both in our structures and on the playing field.

IMPROVED ADMINISTRATION TO SERVE YOU

This Yearbook will show you our progress on the playing fields. At the same time, we have also made less visible, but significant progress behind the scenes. The Board and the Administration of the UIPM have a fully dedicated and motivated group of staff members. They have reviewed processes for allocation of events, improved the professional assistance to organizing committees and worked on standards to provide better conditions for the athletes, who have competed with great dignity and support in a variety of levels of competition conditions.

Also, we have revamped the UIPM internet site and on line systems, we have professionalized our communication tools and we are transforming many of the business processes into more transparent and efficient ones. In summary, we are shaking up the old tree for the good of the sport. The Administration must act as a competent and professional service provider to the modern pentathlon family and, in cooperation with and under the leadership of a strong Board, set the scene and provide the tools for further growth of the sport, according to the directions the members decide at the Congress.

THE 3E PROGRAMME = EDUCATION, EQUIPMENT AND EMPOWERMENT

To grow as a family, UIPM members need to improve their services and offerings on the ground in the various countries. The UIPM must find efficient tools to improve the capabilities of its national federations. Education and transfer of know how are therefore essential for the next years until the 2020 Games and every volunteer that is willing to help as an instructor and advisor will be much needed and welcome. Also, the availability of the Equipment at reasonable costs for the sport is crucial. We are fortunate to have suppliers that are aligned with us in the development plans. Empowerment of our National Federations will then be a natural consequence of their increased know-how and capabilities to run the sport in each country.

THE UIPM CONUNDRUM

Many of you have noticed (and disliked at times) how our sport is changing as we introduced several innovations over the last year. Our sport grows (and is more easily marketable) when our product grows in attractiveness and modern pentathlon is being practiced by more athletes. This is the UIPM conundrum. All recent innovations are aimed at making modern pentathlon more accessible and its competitions more intense, exciting and easier to organize by taking into consideration the prevailing local conditions, the available resources and by partnering also with new multi-sport event organizers.

Our vision is to prove that an athlete can grow from being a champion in one discipline to a true hero, a complete pentathlete and human being at the same time, who masters a whole range of disciplines, from a Modern Biathle, Triathle, Tetrathlon to the Champion Pentathlete champion. As society evolves and the younger generations need more skills to succeed in life in the 21st century than we may have needed just a few decades ago, what better than to offer an opportunity for the athletes of

today and the youth of tomorrow to excel in a combination of skilful disciplines that characterize the Modern Pentathlon of the 21st century? 

As President of the World Olympians Associations we have initiated a world campaign called Target Ebola, engaging all Olympians against the Ebola virus. Finally, I strongly believe that a big part of our future can be played by the combined event as a discipline of Modern Pentathlon, because it is very simple to organise (even more than Biathle), it is inexpensive and it is fun. The Masters Committee thanks Mr Erik Pock for his leadership since his first election in 2008. Mr Pock's experience has been invaluable for Masters, National Federations representatives and ultimately for UIPM.



CULTURAL ACTIVITIES

Modern Pentathlon commemorated this jovial day of camaraderie, good will and friendship in the Egyptian capital Cairo, which has suffered from civil unrest in recent years, giving it a special meaning as the sporting world united for this outstanding cause.

The initiative of involving Modern
Pentathletes in this cause was idealized
by Joel Bouzou, Vice President of UIPM
and President of Peace and Sport. "In one
the greatest actions of the White Card for
Peace campaign, which happened during the World Cup in Cairo, our pentathletes were seen as role models for peace
among six million people involved around
the world. This campaign linked to the
United Nations 6th April celebration of
International Day of Sport for Development
and Peace became a viral on social media."

The occasion was also attended by various members of the Egyptian government, including Minister of Tourism,
Hisham Zazou, Minister of Youth and

INTERNATIONAL PARALYMPIC COMMITTEE (IPC)

On July 21st 2014, the UIPM was granted membership according to the IPC Constitution and was granted the right of Observer at the IPC General Assembly, IPC Sport Council Session and participation at IPC Congresses and Conferences as well as Accreditation for the future Paralympic Games as guests of the IPC.

This membership also presented the chance, for the first time, to participate at the inaugural IPC Gathering, an event that has been strongly supported and promoted by Sir Philip Craven, President of the IPC and former wheelchair basketball Paralympian.

The 25th anniversary was celebrated by a broad audience of participants with a series of initiatives that culminated in the IPC Gathering held in Berlin from October 3-6 2014 and where UIPM was represented by Mr Elmann Larsen and Mr Luca Baracchi.

This presence was fundamental to the gathering of information for the recently constituted para-pentathlon working group and ultimately offered a chance to network with all IPEs, NPCs and official stakeholders surrounding the Paralympic movement.

It is the first time Modern Pentathlon will be represented in this competition through Beach Modern Triathle in 3 events: Individual Men, Individual Women and Mixed Relay so which nations among China, Chinese Taipei, India, Kazakhstan, Korea, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Thailand and Uzbekistan will win the 3 gold medals?

All of these integrations demonstrated that UIPM is becoming involved in an increasing number of international multi-sport Games to develop a wider platform and to allow more countries to participate in the international landscape through different formats of Modern Pentathlon.

The UIPM will continue to pursue its efforts to be part of more international organizations in 2015 and into the future.





IT INNOVATION



INFORMATION **TECHNOLOGY**

In 2014, an event operations and competition management system was launched with the objective to optimize all UIPM internal processes.

During the six-month development, the UIPM integrated brand new IT portal including Event Organizing System (EOS), Competition Management System (CMS) and UIPM Result System. This innovation benefits both fans and press, with the possibility to follow the results in real time on line, and event organizers who can now do all the athlete entries, draws, accommodation, transportation, accreditation, everything through the website.

The UIPM website will also be able to offer a network-like platform aimed at the coaches and athletes to interact and keep the track of sports' development.



EVENT OPERATION SYSTEM (EQS)

REGISTRATION MODULE

Provides online tool for registering individuals and groups for participation and attendance at UIPM events.

- National Federations can register their athletes, coaches and officials to UIPM events and update informations such as arrival and departure, contacts, about pistols, hotel booking and even adding pictures.
- Local Organizing Committees (LOCs) can register their own staff, media, security and VIPs.

ACCREDITATION MODULE

It is used by the LOCs' staff to support the registration and accreditation processes: registering participants of various kinds (e.g. athletes, journalists, technical staff, security, etc.) and the ultimate issue of accreditations in the form of printed passes.



EVENT CALENDAR MODULE

It is used to communicate and display all the important informations regarding to UIPM events.

This module can be used by the LOCs to check competition timetable and the events during the day.



TRANSPORT MODULE

Transport Module is used to manage the vehicles and drivers utilization and to plan for the transfers of accredited participants during the UIPM event, from their arrival to the host city until the departure.

When all the National Federations and other members who attend the UIPM event finish registration, all this information is updated automatically on the Transportation Module, then the organizers will be able to handle transportation for everyone involved in the competition.



ARRIVAL & DEPARTURE MODULE

It is used by the LOCs to manage the arrival and departure data of the accredited persons for the UIPM Events.


FEES PAYMENT MODULE

It is used by the LOC for easy management and handling of various fees related to the organization of the event. This application module includes several accounting functions such as fee calculation and invoicing.

COMPETITION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (CMS)


When the National Federations register all their athletes in the UIPM event, they are automatically registered in the Competition Management System.

MEDICAL & ANTI-DOPING

This year, the UIPM Medical and Anti-Doping Committee remained in control of the fight against doping. Over the season, the UIPM collected 200 in-competition and out-of-competition urine samples for analysis.

Also a blood test was organized in Hungary and forty samples were taken. In addition to this work of control, the UIPM Medical and Anti-Doping Committee has prepared three new documents: UIPM Anti-Doping Rules, UIPM Medical Rules, and UIPM Anti-Doping Procedures, which shall come into effect from 1st January 2015.
