








Multisport Integration Enhancing Modern Pentathlon

We must continuously improve our TV product to be even more entertaining, attractive and easily understandable. The first stop on the Road to LA, is to secure a cool, iconic LA venue, something that can rival Versailles with a Hollywood flair.



Calendar, Growth & Event Financial Transparency

Our calendar is growing exponentially. Can we improve our calendar to minimize travel distances and overall costs and offer more opportunities for all nations to participate with more athletes at reasonable expense? Are LOC's providing the value which the athletes are paying for and expecting?

Our goal should be for Pentathlon to be among the top sports in terms of popularity in the regions hosting our events and we now have the format to make that a reality.









Strategic Development

If we are successful, there will be increased financial resources at our disposal through a number of revenue models, should we promote growth by annual distributions directly to our National Federations to enable local investment in clubs, event organizers, volunteers, coaches, athletes and youth?

We must also retain our strategic policy of maintaining very good relationships with Olympic family leadership. The IOC, ASOIF and Regional Olympic Associations and Games are vitally important . This has been and will remain a UIPM strength.



Regional Games & Athlete Numbers

Multisport and Regional Games are the lifeblood of our sport. They inspire our athletes. Local heroes are created who are vitally important to grow interest in our sport. We should increase the number of athletes per team allowed at our events and we would/should create and own a Multisport Games!









Governance - Excellence is a continuous process

The governance of any organization should be well established and transparent, but also dynamic in responding to the needs of our stakeholders. UIPM governance, under our current leadership has a strong record of success.

We must continue to evolve as an organization and encourage and improve our athletes' participation in our activities.
